PUBLIC NOTICE NO: 22 /2019-CUS

Sub: Applications for written examination of Customs Broker Licence under Regulation-6, CBLR, 2018 to be held on 06.03.2020-reg.

Kind attention is invited to the Notice dated 22.08.2019 for Customs Brokers Examination, 2020 issued by the NATIONAL ACADEMY OF CUSTOMS, INDIRECT TAXES & NARCOTICS, FARIDABAD (in Short 'NACIN'). It is hereby notified to all that the written examination under Regulation-6 of the Customs Brokers Licencing Regulations, 2018 (CBLR, 2018), which is a pre-requisite for grant of Customs Brokers Licence, is being conducted on 06.03.2020.

2. Regulation 5 of the CBLR, 2018 stipulates the eligibility conditions for the said examination.
3. Complete application by a person/firm who intend to transact business in the jurisdiction of Customs Commissionerate, Ludhiana is to be submitted in person or by Registered/Speed Post in Form 'A' (available in CBLR, 2018) along with two passport size photos & self-attested documents on citizenship (Aadhar/Passport/Voter Card), educational qualification, financial viability, mobile number, e-mail id and other documents/ requirements (as per enclosed Annexure) along with the prescribed fee of Rs.500/- (Rupees Five Hundred only) to the office of the Commissioner of Customs, Customs Hqrs., ICD-GRFL, GT Road, Sahnewal, Ludhiana from 14.10.2019 to 15.11.2019 up to 1800 hrs. Application sent by post, in case received after the last date shall not be entertained.
4. Before submitting the application, applicant should ensure the completeness of the application. Incomplete application shall be summarily rejected.
5. Syllabus of the written examination will be as per Regulation 6(7) of CBLR, 2018.
6. Examination of the applicant. — (i) An applicant, who satisfies the requirements of regulation 5, shall be required to appear for an online written as well as oral examination being conducted by NACIN.

Provided that an applicant who has already passed the examination referred to in regulation 9 of the Custom House Agents Licensing Regulation, 1984 or regulation 8 of the Custom House Agents Licensing Regulation, 2004 or regulation 6 of the Customs Brokers Licensing Regulations, 2013 shall not be required to appear for any further examination.

(ii) The online written examination will be a Computer Based exam with Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) of two and a half hours (10.30 hrs to 13.00 hrs) duration. Questions will be bilingual i.e in English and Hindi. The pattern of the examination will be as follows:

(iii) Those qualifying the written examination will have to appear for oral examination in terms of Regulation 6 of the above said Regulations. The oral examination will be held during the second quarter of the calendar year 2020. The pass percentage marks for qualifying in the oral examination will be 60%.

(iv) A dummy question paper for the purpose of awareness of the candidate will be made available on the CBIC and NACIN website www.cbic.gov.in and www.nacin.gov.in under the icon/tab <GSTP/CBLR EXAM> from February, 2020. A link to download the Admit Card will also be provided therein. Admit Cards shall also be sent by e-mail to eligible candidates 15 days in advance before the date of examination. For convenience of candidates, other necessary details like list of centres, guidelines to the candidates, help desks, e-mail Id etc. will also be made available under the said icon/tab.

(v) Names of the applicants found eligible to appear in examination will be displayed on the notice board and/or website (<http://www.ludhianacustoms.gov.in>) latest by 22.11.2019.

(vi) The applicant shall be required to clear both the written examination as well as corresponding oral examination.

(vii) An attempt at the written exam shall be deemed to be an attempt and notwithstanding the disqualification/cancellation of application, the fact of appearance of the applicant at the examination will count as an attempt.

(viii) An applicant shall be allowed a maximum of six attempts to clear the examination.

(ix) The examination may include questions on the following:

- (a) preparation of various kinds of bills of entry, bills of export, shipping bills, and other clearance documents;
- (b) arrival entry and clearance of vessels;
- (c) tariff classification and rates of duty;
- (d) determination of value of imported and export goods;

- (e) conversion of currency;
- (f) nature and description of documents to be filed with various kinds of bills of entry, shipping bills and other clearance documents;
- (g) procedure for assessment and payment of duty including refund of duty paid;
- (h) examination of goods at Customs Stations;
- (i) prohibitions on import and export;
- (j) bonding procedure and clearance from bond;
- (k) re-importation and conditions for free re-entry;
- (l) drawback and export promotion schemes including the Special Economic Zone scheme;
- (m) offences under the Act;
- (n) provisions of the allied Acts including the Central Goods and Services Act, 2017 (12 of 2017) and section 5 of the Integrated Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (13 of 2017), the Indian Explosives Act, 1884 (4 of 1884), the Destructive Insects and Pests Act 1914 (2 of 1914), the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (2 of 1930), the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 (23 of 1940), the Central Excise Act, 1944 (1 of 1944), the Copy Right Act, 1957 (14 of 1957), the Trade and Merchandise Marks Act 1958 (43 of 1958), the Arms Act 1959 (54 of 1959), the Patents Act, 1970 (39 of 1970), the Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (61 of 1985), the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986), the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulations) Act, 1992 (22 of 1992), the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 (42 of 1999), the Design Act, 2000 (16 of 2000) and the Food Safety and Standard Act, 2006 (No. 34 of 2006) and other laws for the time being in force applicable to EXIM trade and the rules and regulations made under these Acts in so far as they are relevant to clearance of goods through Customs;
- (o) provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (49 of 1998);
- (p) procedure for appeal and revision applications under the Act; and
- (q) online filing of electronic bills of entry and shipping bills vide the Indian Customs and Central Excise Electronic Commerce or Electronic data interchange gateway (ICEGATE) and Indian Customs Electronic data Interchange System (ICES).
- (r) knowledge of regulations, rules, notifications, etc. under the Customs Act and other Allied Acts.

(x) The Principal Commissioner/Commissioner of Customs shall satisfy himself that the individual applicant or in cases where applicant is a firm or company, its partner or Director or authorised employees who may be engaged for handling the customs work shall possess satisfactory knowledge of English and the local language of the Customs Station:

Provided that in case of a person deputed to work extensively in the docks, knowledge of English shall not be compulsory and knowledge of Hindi shall be considered as desirable qualification.

7. In case the declarations/information made and/or documents furnished are found to be incorrect, the application shall be rejected or license (if issued) shall be cancelled.



1. Undertaking on Stamp Paper of Rs.500/- duly notarized in respect of following
 - a. He is a citizen of India.
 - b. He is a Person of sound mind.
 - c. He is not adjudicated as insolvent.
 - d. He has neither been convicted by a competent court for an offence nor any criminal proceedings are pending against him in any Court of law.
 - e. He has not been penalised for any offence under the Customs Act, the Central Excise Act, 1944 and the Finance Act, 1994.
2. Copy of Aadhar Card/Passport/Certificate issued by Tehsildar.
3. Certificate issued by C.M.O. stating that the applicant is a person of sound mind.
4. Certificates in respect of Educational Qualification service.
5. Certificate issued by the competent authority in respect of retired Group 'A' officers stating that he is having a minimum of five year experience in Group 'A' Service.
6. Bank solvency certificate for Rs.5,00,000/- issued by a Scheduled Bank/Certificate issued by Tehsildar stating that the applicant is in possession of assets of value of not less than Five Lakh Rupees.
